DEFINITION:

Participates in structured assignments in preparation for successful progression into an administrative occupational field.

CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS:

Positions allocable to this class typically report to an assigned supervisor and/or mentor and receive both technical job training and guidance on workplace behavior, competencies, individual responsibilities, and development of administrative occupational skill sets. Veteran Intern, Administrative Support positions are assigned to assist journey or higher-level professional and technical administrative staff in central or line departments by researching, analyzing, and making recommendations for the solution of a variety of problems of budget, organization, program, or personnel to enhance previous job skills or to gain new experience in the administrative occupational area.

Positions receive formal and informal instruction on the principles of administrative support to govern satisfactory performance of the job. The internship program prepares veterans to compete for entry and journey-level administrative support jobs to continue public service in the area in which they have received training. Typically, veterans participate in this program for 12 to 24 months based on individual training and experience requirements. During the duration of the internship program, incumbents are expected to develop and demonstrate progressively increasing skills and to work with greater independence of action as they gain further experience and proficiency in their occupation for progression into permanent County positions. Intern assignments may be made on any shift, including County departments that have 24-hour responsibilities.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

Depending on the area of assignment, duties may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Participates in the research, analysis, interpretation, and recommendation of various administrative support activities related to budgetary requirements, department or agency organization, programs, and personnel.

- Researches information and analyzes statistical data to assist in housekeeping and record keeping functions.
- Assists in the preparation and the presentation of oral and/or written reports.
- Assists in promoting and maintaining public relations for various programs, services, or activities.
- Learns the structure and operation of County government.
- Attends training sessions and staff conferences.

REQUIREMENTS:

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

No experience required; however, the veteran must have been discharged or released from active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States Armed Forces under honorable conditions.

LICENSE:

A valid California Class C Driver License or the ability to utilize an alternative method of transportation when needed to carry out job-related essential functions.

A valid DD214, Certificate of Discharge or Separation from Active Duty, is required.

PHYSICAL CLASS

Applications will be processed on an as received basis and those earning a passing score will be promulgated to the eligible register accordingly.

Your Responsibilities:

1. Completing Your Application:

- a. Before submission of the application, it is your responsibility to ensure that all information provided is correct and complete on the application. Incomplete applications cannot be accepted.

- c. Please include your Social Security Number for record control purposes. Federal law requires that all employed persons have a Social Security Number.
- d. To receive APPROPRIATE CREDIT, include a copy of your diploma, transcript, certificate, or license as directed on the job posting.

2. Minimum or Selection Requirements are listed in the job posting.

- a. YOUR APPLICATION WILL BE ACCEPTED ONLY IF IT CLEARLY SHOWS YOU MEET THESE REQUIREMENTS. The information you give will determine your eligibility and is subject to verification at any time.

Veteran's Credit: In all open competitive examinations, a veteran's credit of 10 percent of the total credits specified for such examinations will be added to the final passing grade of an honorably discharged veteran who served in the Armed Forces of the United States under any of the following conditions: During a declared war; -or- During the period April 28, 1952 through July 1, 1955; -or- For more than 180 consecutive days, other than for training, any part of which occurred after January 31, 1955, and before October 15, 1976; -or- During the Gulf War from August 2, 1990 through January 2, 1992; -or- For more than 180 consecutive days, other than for training, any part of which occurred during the period beginning September 11, 2001, and ending on August 31, 2010 the last day of Operation Iraqi Freedom; -or- In a campaign or expedition for which a campaign medal or expeditionary medal has been authorized and awarded. Any Armed Forces Expeditionary medal or campaign badge, including El Salvador, Lebanon, Grenada, Panama, Southwest Asia, Somalia, and Haiti qualifies for credit.

A campaign medal holder or Gulf War veteran who originally enlisted after September 7, 1980 (or began active duty on or after October 14, 1982, and has not previously completed 24 months of continuous active duty) must have served continuously for 24 months or the full period called or ordered to active duty.

This also applies to the spouse of such person who, while engaged in such service

Benefit Information: Depending on the position, the successful candidate will enroll in a contributory defined benefit pension plan if the candidate is a "new member" of the County's defined benefit plan (LACERA) on or after January 1, 2013 (first employed by the County on or after December 1, 2012) - unless she or he established reciprocity with another public retirement system in which she or he was a member before January 1, 2013. It should be noted that County employees do not pay into Social Security, but do pay the Medical Hospital Insurance Tax portion of Social Security at a rate of 1.45%.
